

### Genetic Screening Activity 1

Questions 1-4 should be answered in your role group. Questions 5-7 only after discussion with other role groups.

1. What is your group's role:
2. What interest is at stake for your role? Be specific and explain the nature of the interest in as much detail as possible (you may flesh this out through role play).
3. What ethical basis can you provide for preferring your interest over competing interests? Explain in terms of ethical principals, if possible.
4. What similar ethical situations might you cite as analogies to your interest in this situation?

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Meet with the other stakeholder groups. Each group should role-play the presentation of their interests and their reactions to the presentation of other stakeholder interests. Back and fourth and discussion is encouraged, but remember, all conversation should be from within your role. Your goal is both to defend your interest and attempt to reach a workable solution. Record your answers to the following questions on the back of this page only after the conclusion of the stakeholder conversation.

5. What are the interests of the other stakeholder groups?
6. Is a solution possible that is consistent with your interests that other stakeholders will agree to?
7. What solution is most consistent with all of the stakeholder interests collectively? Explain. (another way of thinking about this question is (based on the graphic shown in class), is there a way to move from self interest to justice?
